Wedgwood Medallion



Della was able to show us a medallion depicting John Wesley. This is a memorial medallion made by Wedgwood following the death of John Wesley in 1791. The provenance is that the Medallion was presented to John Hall of Bristol, one of John Wesley's strongest supporters. The date on the plaque refers to John Hall's death. It has been passed down through the direct descendants of John Hall before being given to Della.

Figure 1 - Front showing profile of John Wesley

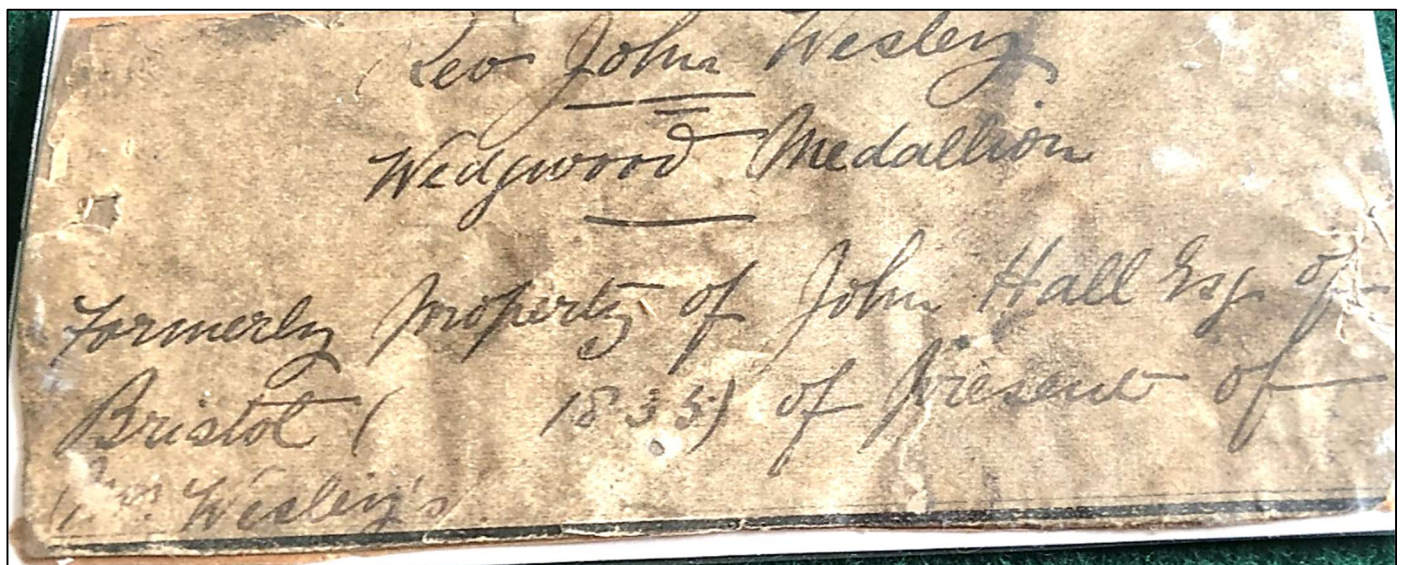


Figure 2 - Back showing a plaque
